An accomplished player, Pillar won the 2019 and 2020 Senior Philadelphia Section Championship, 2014 Pennsylvania State Open and 2009 Philadelphia Section Championship. Pillar competed in the 2017 Senior U.S. Open Championship, 1997 U.S. Open Championship, 11 PGA Professional Championships and four Senior PGA Professional Championships.

Pillar was honored on several occasions for his significant contributions to the Philadelphia PGA Section, including the Section's 2019 PGA Patriot Award; a five-time Merchandiser of the Year award recipient (2003, '05, '06, '07, '14); and was the Philadelphia Section 2007 PGA Golf Professional of the Year.

"As the PGA of America's mission is to serve the Member and grow the game of golf, I am privileged to represent my fellow PGA Members as the new District Director," said Pillar. "I'm excited to collaborate with some of the most accomplished leaders in golf."
